Sébastien Doubinsky is a French radical poet and novelist whose work has been praised by critics as innovative, audacious, and provocative. He is also the grandson of the famous Ukrainian Jewish anarchist Iakov (Jacques) Dubinsky. He is the author of 12 novels and several collection of poems among which *Les Vies parallèles de Nicolai Bakhmaltov* (1993); *Fragments d'une révolution* (1998); *La Comédie urbaine* (2004); *Jours de lumière* (2009). Doubinsky is also the editor of the literary journal *Le Zaporogue* and is a professor of French literature at the University of Aarhus in Denmark.

His collection of poems *A quiet café in Cairo* and first three novels published under the title *The Babylonian trilogy* (2009) are also available in English.
