- CLAS is responsible for teaching the majority of the university's core curriculum to the university's 35,000 undergraduate students each year.
- CLAS has more than 12,000 undergraduates pursuing a variety of disciplines through its 42 majors and 42 minors. Additionally, nearly 2,000 graduate students are also attaining advanced degrees in the college.
- The college faculty ranks among the best in the nation and has received a variety of national and international awards, including Guggenheim Fellowships, Senior Fulbright Awards, National Science Foundation Fellowships, Presidential Young Investigator Awards and National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowships.
- CLAS faculty hold memberships in the National Academy of Science, the Nobel Prize Committee, the Swedish Royal Academy of Sciences, the Royal Societies of London and Edinburgh, and AAAS.
- During the past several years, CLAS has had a Rhodes Scholar, as well as Fulbrights, and Goldwater, Truman, and Madison Scholars.
