Second Year Course: **Introduction to Environmental Science** (1999 – 2004)

Three hours per week lectures, Three hours practical per week

- The concept of environment, natural resources, demography and land use

Three hours per week lectures, Three hours practical per week

- Basic principles guiding the management of fish and other terrestrial animals in wild habitats.
- Management of organisms, habitats, human users from biological, chemical, physical, ecological and sociological theories and practices.

Fourth Year Course: **Sociology of the Environment** (2000)

Three hours per week lectures

- The course examines the interaction between society and the natural environment.
